
### NOVEMBER

# Applications Available for 2024 Property Tax/Rent Rebate

Eligible participants can receive a rebate of up to \$1,000 based on their rent or property taxes paid in 2024. The state program benefits eligible Pennsylvanians who are 65 years or older, widows and widowers 50 years or older, and those 18 years or older with disabilities.

The income limit is \$46,520 a year for homeowners and renters, and half of Social Security income is excluded. As always, my district office staff stand ready to help participants apply for their rebates FREE OF CHARGE. They should be prepared to provide all the necessary income, property tax or rental information required to process claims quickly and accurately. Applications are due by June 30.

# **Attention, Veterans!**

Veterans living in the 116<sup>th</sup> Legislative District are reminded that I host outreach days at my Hazleton office every month. The free sessions are by appointment only. Veterans assistance is available on the second Tuesday of each month and on the fourth Wednesday every other month.

On those days, American Legion Department Service Officer William McGovern will be available to meet with veterans or their dependents. Veterans do not need to be an American Legion member to take part in the program.
